Visitation Fact Sheet

At this time, we are following the guidelines and recommendations from CMS and the local health departments to determine if a facility is able to participate in outdoor and/or indoor visitation. Please contact the facility directly to inquire about their current visitation status as this may change frequently depending on the positivity rate in the facility and in the local county. As the weather is changing, we are working on plans to allow indoor visits if a facility meets the required criteria and the local health departments allow. We will notify our residents' representatives when the facility is able to safely accommodate indoor visits.

Our rules for indoor and outdoor visits are as follows:

- Visits must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance and are subject to availability as space may be limited
- Limit of no more than 2 visitors per resident and visitors must be from the same household
- Visits are limited to no more than one per day per resident, lasting no longer than 30 minutes in order to accommodate all residents and families.
- Visitors must pass temperature and symptom screening
- Visitors must maintain 6-foot social distancing from the resident (no physical contact is allowed) (If a resident is fully vaccinated, they can chose to have close contact with their visitor while wearing a well-fitting cloth mask or face covering and performing hand-hygiene before and after).
- Visitors must wear a mask covering nose and mouth at all times
- Visitors must perform hand hygiene upon entering the facility.
- Visitors must notify the facility if they develop Covid-19 symptoms within 3 days after visiting
- Residents who are in quarantine or symptomatic may not participate in any visitations
- Proof of negative COVID-19 test in the past 7 days may be required for indoor visits
- Indoor visits will not be allowed when the county positivity rate is above 10%
- If there are any new positive cases in the facility, visitations will be suspended for at least 14 days
